Its hard to believe we are nearing the end of 2016, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support towards TSC this year. We have had a busy and successful year for the club and it's swimmers once again.

This local sporting club exists because we have a dedicated group of coaches who give up their time to develop your swimmers, and we could not run the club without them. The other essential force behind the swimming club is the group of parents and volunteers who make the annual club calendar events happen, and organise these often complex events you see during the year. In 2016 we started off the year with our club awards for swimmers at the January presentation night, and moved on to see a record number of our swimmers achieve county and regional qualifying times in January, February and May. We have also seen many of our competitive swimmers reach new personal best swimming times for their racing at the club, and taught younger swimmers water confidence and how to swim 25m in all four strokes, which is a great achievement for our smallest club members. During 2016, TSC organised a licensed level 4 meet for the Club Championships and also held the successful 10th Tiverton Sparkler, a licensed level 3 open meet that we are immensely proud of running at the club. We took teams of swimmers to the 2016 Mini League, Interclub and Arena league team galas, and supported lots swimmers at a wide variety of open swim meets, race nights and distance swimming nights. There was also much fun in the summer on the giant inflatables at the pool and at the Fun-splash nights on the run up to Christmas.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the coaching team and parent volunteers at the club for continuing to make the swimming club function so well for our members - you all do a great job for so many youngsters in the local community.

Annual ASA and club fees for 2017

For Tiverton swimming club to function, our members pay both an **annual membership fee** (this comprises a combined fee to both TSC and the ASA) which is taken as a one off payment, **AND** a **monthly subscription fee** (this is to hire the EVLC pool and to pay the head coach).

The ASA and TSC committee have now set the **annual membership fees** for 2017. Category 1 swimmers will pay £30 and Category 2 swimmers £47.35. The annual fees are a combination of mandatory ASA membership fees and a £17 contribution towards the cost of running the club for swimmers throughout the year.

Each year we have to collect the mandatory ASA annual membership fee and pay the ASA by March to avoid the club being fined for late payment. At the same time, TSC also collect their annual club membership fee which finances the "hidden costs" of running the club (e.g. trophies, awards, computers, printers, toners, website, IT software, meeting room hire, new club kit, funsplash, team competition fees, uniforms, etc). As a rule of thumb, any swimmer who competes in open meets, or county/regional events and in the arena league <u>must</u> be ASA category two registered and those only competing in club championships and mini leagues (or not racing at all) are ASA category one registered. If you start out the year as a "Cat 1" swimmer and decide to enter an open meet, then there is an option to upgrade to "Cat 2" during the year to meet the ASA

10th Tiverton Sparkler

We held the 10th Annual Sparkler Gala with approximately 220 youngsters from 16 clubs around the South West competing at the Exe Valley Leisure Centre on Nov 6th. Twenty nine members of TSC took part and had a successful day by claiming a total of 54 medals between them.

9 year old Emma Declerk, swimming in her first Sparkler, bagged an impressive gold medal in the 200m backstroke as well as silvers in the 50m freestyle and 50m backstroke. In the 10 year old age group Bethany Moakes won bronze in the 50m butterfly and gained five personal best times. There were also personal bests for Arabella Boyde who claimed three, Cadie Yardley with two and one for Corbyn Spargo. There were also successes for the 11 year olds, with Jodie Dilks winning golds in the 200m freestyle and 200m breaststroke, as well as a further five silvers and one bronze. Gemma Dilks didn't disappoint either, claiming gold in the 200m backstroke, silver in the 100m freestyle and another three bronze medals. Jessica Swanston gained two pb's and was rewarded with a bronze medal in the 100m breaststroke and there were also strong performances from Isaac Reaves, Peter Smith, Lucy Webber and Wilfred Arrowsmith, who notched up several pb's between them. 12 year old Amy Stewart won silver medals in the 100m individual medley and the 200m breaststroke, Jon Carpenter-Smith claimed a bronze in the 100m breaststroke and Olivia Broom did likewise in the 100m individual medley and the 50m freestyle. There were also four pb's from Sophie Attwood-Groves and three from Micah Partridge. Representing the 13 year old boys, Sam Arrowsmith, Jack Aldridge, Kai Clayton and Robert Jones dominated their age group by winning nine golds, six silvers and five bronze medals between them. Emily Peters also put in a fine performance and gained two great pb's. For the 14 year olds, Finn Stoneman was rewarded for his efforts with gold medals in the 100m individual medley, the 100m and 200m backstroke. Dylan Cleverley and Yasmin Smith both grabbed bronze medals in the 200m backstroke and Jessica Fitch secured pb's in both of her races.

15 year old Katie Walton was on top form, winning gold in the 200m freestyle, silver in the 100m backstroke and three further bronze medals. Oliver Bennet claimed silver in the 100m butterfly

Devon Intercounties Masters gala

Four Masters swimmers were selected to represent Devon in the County Masters team. Rebecca Jenkinson, Graham Cridland, Sue Haigh and Lucy Boyde competed in the regional round of the National Inter-County event held in Dorchester. Six teams took part which included Devon, Somerset, Cornwall, Dorset, Wiltshire and Gloucestershire. The quartet swam a total of 16 events between them, which included relays and individual events. All four swimmers put in a great performance helping Devon win back the regional trophy.The final result was Devon with 346.5 points, Dorset 294.5, Gloucestershire 245, Cornwall 211, Wilts 196.5 and Somerset 131.5. This is a fantastic achievement which places Devon 5th out of a total of 28 teams nationally.

Plymouth L2 November Meet.

Thirteen swimmers from Tiverton Swimming Club travelled to Plymouth Life Centre to compete in the Plymouth Leander Level 2 Winter Qualifier. There was tough competition, but their efforts did not go unrewarded as a total of 25 medals were won and a phenomenal 45 personal best times were set. 11 year olds Jodie and Gemma Dilks led the way with Gemma collecting gold medals in the 400m individual medley, 200m and 50m backstroke, plus three silvers and a bronze. Jodie bagged golds in the 50m and 100m butterfly, as well as five silvers and two bronze medals. In the same age group, Jessica Swanston, Lucy Webber and Wilfred Arrowsmith were also on top form, gaining eight personal best times between them. For the 10 year olds, Cadie Yardley gained PB's in both of her swims, finishing in 6th place in the 200m freestyle and Arabella Boyde matched that position in the 200m backstroke whilst gaining a superb ten second PB. In the 13 year old age group Jack Aldridge celebrated with silver in the 50m butterfly, plus three further bronze medals and Sam Arrowsmith gained silver in the 200m breaststroke and two bronze medals. Kai Clayton swam a fantastic PB in the 100m backstroke and finished 4th in the 50m breaststroke. 15 year old Katie Walton's fine form was rewarded with five PB's and a bronze medal in the gruelling 400m freestyle. Oliver Bennet (15) worked hard to
