Coach and teacher updates

We are delighted to welcome Claire Richardson as a new volunteer coach for the club. Claire has coached swimming in America and Portugal and is a level 2 ASA UK qualified swimming coach and has a SW Regional Relays level 3 coach qualification in USA. Claire has been coaching Barnstaple Masters swimmers before moving areas and joining us at Tiverton and will coach swimmers in the Skill Development and Masters squad. We would also like to congratulate another of our volunteer coaches, Teresa Smith who was awarded the ASA level 2 certificate in coaching swimming award in April, after completing her training and final assessment. We have waved goodbye to Steve Radford, one of our volunteer swim teachers who has been a regular feature at the Friday night Learn to Swim sessions, and thank him for his time and commitment to the club. Alison Williams who currently volunteers teaching swimming on Sunday evenings, will switch sessions and move to join the Learn to Swim team on Friday nights from September.

SW Regional Championships

The club had a record number of twelve of its best young swimmers qualify to compete at this year's ASA South West Regional Age Group and Youth Championships and between them they reached seven finals and gained 37 personal best times. Only around 5% of the fastest swimmers in the six counties of the South West gain the qualifying times to compete at this prestigious event, so for a club of Tiverton's size this is a tremendous achievement and just reward for all the hours of hard work put in by everyone.

At the Age Group Championships 13 year old Jack Aldridge was in fine form, setting personal best times in eight different events and in the process qualified for all three breaststroke finals, where he finished 10th Sparkler open meet 7th in the 50m & 100m and 8th in the 200m. Sam Arrowsmith also set eight pb's and reached two butterfly finals, finishing 5th in the 100m and 7th in the 200m. Making up a talented guartet in that age group were Kai Clayton, who set pb's in the 50m butterfly, 100m & 200m freestyle and Robert Jones who did likewise in the 200m freestyle. 14 year old Finn Stoneman set pb's in the 50m & 100m backstroke and 11 year old Sam Ellis managed the same feat in all three butterfly events and reached the final of the 200m, where he finished in 6th place. 10 year old Jodie Dilks set five pb's and was unlucky not to reach a breaststroke final after finishing as second reserve in both the 100m and 200m. Gemma Dilks (10) gained a pb in the 100m backstroke and Olivia Broom (12) did likewise in the 200m breaststroke. Jake Stoneman (16), Oliver Bennet (15) and Will Goffey (15) all competed at the Youth Championships, with Stoneman setting a pb in reaching the 100m breaststroke final, where he finished in 10th place and Goffey setting pb's in the 100m freestyle, 50m breaststroke, 50m & 100m backstrokes.

Devon County Development gala

Sixteen swimmers travelled to Plymouth Life Centre to take part in the Devon Development Gala, many of whom were taking part in their first competitive meet. The team was in fine form, bringing home a total of thirteen medals as well as gaining numerous personal best times. Katie Walton led the way by bagging seven medals and gaining eight personal best times. She brought home silver medals in the 100m butterfly, 100m, 200m and 800m freestyle and bronze in the 100m breaststroke, 100m individual medley and 400m freestyle. Dylan Cleverley was also in fine form, gaining pb's in all ten of his races and winning silver medals in the 200m individual medley and the gruelling 1500m freestyle, as well as bronze in the 400m freestyle. Guy Cridland was really unlucky not to win a medal after finishing fourth in all five of his races in personal best times. Micah Partridge had four great personal best swims and was rewarded with a silver medal in the Dylan Cleverley swam 22 miles over 3 months 200m individual medley and bronze in the 100m individual

The 10th Sparkler (TSC's annual open meet) has been approved and licenced as a level 3 open meet by SouthWest Regional ASA, and will be held on Sunday 6th November at EVLC pool. The meet pack is available from the club website including details of the promoters conditions, including the no faster than and no slower than times for swimmers to enter. This year all of the competitors entry times must have been achieved during licenced meets and also be logged onto the ASA ranking site. The closing date for the Sparkler is October 6th.

Devon Interclub gala

In June, we sent fourteen of our fastest swimmers to the Plymouth Life Centre to compete in the 2016 Devon Inter-Club Gala against ten other clubs from the county. The day began with the traditional parade to use the facility in August. We hope to return to of club pennants carried by two swimmers from each club and this year it was Sidonie Andrews and Jack Aldridge who were given the honour of representing Tiverton at the head of the parade. In a competition that is dominated by Plymouth Leander who won 20 of the 38 events, we were delighted to come next on the wins list, finishing first on six occasions, which helped us to an overall position of sixth place.

The 11 and under team was represented superbly by Gemma Dilks, Jodie Dilks, Wilfred Arrowsmith and Sam Ellis who all gained personal best times and teamed up to win the mixed medley relay. Sam Ellis also won the 50m freestyle and 50m butterfly, with Jodie Dilks doing likewise in the 50m butterfly and 50m breaststroke. Gemma Dilks finished first in the 50m backstroke and third in the 50m freestyle. Sam Arrowsmith, Kai Clayton, Jack Aldridge, Sidonie Andrews and Olivia Broom competed in the 13 and under team, with all swimmers gaining personal best times. Sam Arrowsmith secured second place in the 50m butterfly and third place in the 50m backstroke, whilst Jack Aldridge and Kai Clayton raced strongly to finish second in the 50m breaststroke and third in the 50m freestyle respectively.

Fast 5 Regional sprint gala

Four boys travelled to the GL1 Centre in Gloucester to take part in the 338 followers, and we would like to see this reach South West Regional "Fast Five" sprint meet. All four boys had achieved regional swimming qualifying times during the year, which allowed them entry into this prestigious event where they swim 50m sprints in all four strokes and the 100m individual medley. Twelve year old Sam Arrowsmith was in fine form, finishing 5th in the butterfly and 6th in the breaststroke in a personal best time, which helped him to a fantastic 6th place overall. Also swimming well was Jack Aldridge (13) who claimed 4th place in the breaststroke, as well as gaining two personal best times to help him finish 13th overall. Kai Clayton (12) swam an incredibly quick freestyle to finish in 2nd place and he achieved personal best times in all five events to secure 16th place overall. Eleven year old Sam Ellis put in a great performance to claim 3rd place in the butterfly and gained two personal best times to end the TSC volunteers request day in 21st position.

Summer shut down is over!



On Sunday 15th May two TSC Masters swimmers, Rebecca Jenkinson (53) and Lucy Boyde competed in the annual Royal what to take to a swim meet, competition advice, Navy Masters 25m Open meet at Millfield. Rebecca is competing in 50m free and two backstroke events at the European Masters Championship at the London Aquatic Centre at the end of May."
